Symbolism of the Covenant in a Wedding Ceremony



- Seating of the family & guests on opposite sides of auditorium/center aisle. Why?
 - Covenant setting... "Living sacrifices."
- Why is there often a white runner?
 Represents "holy ground."
- Groom enters first why?
 - He is to *initiate* the covenant, and has the greater responsibility.

Rings – "a token of covenant."








Covenant vs. Contract

Covenant vs. Contract



Solomon in Proverbs 20:25

- "It is a snare to rashly say 'it is holy' and then later make inquiry." NASV
- "It is a danger to a man to say without thought, 'It is holy,' and after taking his vows, to be questioning if it is necessary to keep them. BBE
- "An impulsive vow is a trap; later you'll wish you could get out of it." *The Message*

Our society has undervalued the keeping of our word.






Keeping of Vows is a Serious Matter.

- 3. I will be what a husband and wife owes to their spouse (Meet your needs).






We need a thorough and insightful understanding of Six Marital Promises.
