









ACTS 2:42-47

"were <u>selling</u> their possessions and belongings and <u>distributing</u> the proceeds to <u>all</u>, as <u>any</u> had need"

"no one said that any of the things that belonged to him was his own, but they had everything in common"

"there was not a needy person among them, for as many as were owners of lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold and laid it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to each as any had need."

Why did the first century church place such a great emphasis on benevolence?

THEY EMPHASIZED BENEVOLENCE **BECAUSE JESUS COMMANDED HIS FOLLOWERS TO BE** BENEVOLENT.

"Give to the one who begs from you, and do not refuse the one who would borrow from you"

"Sell your possessions, and give to the needy"

"Contribute to the needs of saints"

"do good to <u>everyone</u> and <u>especially to those who are of the household of faith"</u>

THEY EMPHASIZED BENEVOLENCE BECAUSE THEY RECOGNIZED THAT WE ARE JUST STEWARDS OF THE **FUNDS ENTRUSTED TO** US BY GOD.

Steward: "a person who manages another's property or financial affairs."

"neither did anyone say that any of the things he possessed was his own"

THEY EMPHASIZED BENEVOLENCE BECAUSE THEY UNDERSTOOD **THAT WORLDLY** TREASURES ARE ONLY TEMPORARY.

"had compassion on those in prison, and...joyfully accepted the plundering of [their] property, [because they] knew that [they] had a better possession and an abiding one." "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal."

THEY EMPHASIZED **BENEVOLENCE BECAUSE JESUS ASSOCIATED BENEVOLENCE WITH** THE KINGDOM.

"One thing you still lack. Sell all that you have and distribute to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow me."

"For it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich person to enter the kingdom of God."

Since Zacchaeus' benevolent actions resulted in "salvation" and the Rich Ruler's greed caused him to walk away from "the kingdom of God," we can conclude that discipleship necessitates benevolent mindedness.

The sheep will "inherit the kingdom" because they gave food to the hungry, gave drink to the thirsty, welcomed strangers, clothed the naked, visited the sick and the imprisoned.

The goats will be dismissed "into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels" because they did not give food to the hungry or drink to the thirsty, they did not welcome strangers, clothe the naked, visit the sick or the imprisoned.

Our wealth, no matter how great or small, is entrusted to us by God, who is our Master.

Our wealth is really His wealth, and, as a result, we will give an account to Him one day for how we used it.
