 The land of Egypt to become desolate and waste; the Lord was against them.
 Ezekiel 29:9-12 (990)

> And the land of Egypt shall become desolate and waste; then they will know that I am the LORD, because he said, 'The River is mine, and I have made it."





2) Egypt would become a base nation. Ezekiel 29:14-15 (p 990)

It shall be the lowliest of kingdoms; it shall never again exalt itself above the nations, for I will diminish them so that they will not rule over the nations anymore.





- Assyria defeated Egypt in 700 B.C
- Esarhaddon captured Memphis 671 B.C.
- <u>Nebuchadnezzar</u> defeated Pharaoh
 Neco at Carchemish in 605 B.C.

Jeremiah 46 (p 927)

- Persians defeated Egypt in 525 B.C.
- Alexander the Great ruled 332 B.C.



<u>Ptolemy</u> ruled Egypt from 305 B.C. to 30 B.C.

Upon the death of Cleopatra in 30
 B.C., "Egypt became a vassal state for many centuries. The <u>Roman</u> rule of Egypt was oppressive"
 (Wilson, ibid)



- In the 7th Century A.D. <u>Muslim</u> invaders entered Alexandria.
- Later the <u>Saracens</u> (Arabs Moslems) ruled, then the <u>Mamelukes</u> (1250-1571).
