It is the same activity in which... the angelic multitude engaged at the birth of Jesus –Luke 2:13

It is the same activity in which... the shepherds engaged after seeing baby Jesus in the manger – Luke 2:20

It is the same activity in which... one of the ten lepers engaged when he returned to fall at the feet of Jesus – Luke 17:16

It is the same activity in which... the lame man engaged after Peter and John cured his disability - Acts 3:8-9

It is the involuntary and necessary reaction to <u>experiencing the</u> goodness and majesty of God.

PRAISING GOD SHOULD BE PRIORITIZED.
